National Cluster Policy Framework Development in Sweden

- 1990s: Early (regional) government supported cluster initiatives within forest industry and life science
- 2000s: Regional cluster program development support by nat'l govt
- Early 2010s: National Strategic Innovation Programs (SIP)
- Late 2010s:
 - Integration with EU policies => Clusterix
 - Smart Specialisation Strategy implementation => S3-Piloten
- 2020s: Alignment with broader EU objectives => Clusters of Sweden



Regions Take the Lead: Integration with EU Cluster Policies -Cluster Monitoring Framework

- Developed in the EU project Clusterix 2.0 in conjunction with Skåne's cluster development program 2017–2021.
- Region Skåne responsible for the work package, Skåne's cluster participated along with European clusters.
- Based on the metrics developed for cluster certification by ESCA => EUCLES.
- Used today to some extent in the follow-up that Region Skåne does of innovation actors who receive operational support.




S3-Piloten 2018 – 2020: Gathering clusters in Sweden Conclusions from the project

- Need to reach more cluster leaders with the successful S3 pilot effort.
- The Swedish Agency should continue S3 pilot methods in future efforts.
- Future efforts should focus on networking and experience sharing.
- The Swedish Agency should keep its role in cluster development.
- The Swedish Agency should help regions increase their involvement in cluster development.
- The Swedish Agency should advocate for a national cluster platform and inter-agency coordination.



2021: Clusters of Sweden

- S3-Piloten clearly demonstrated the need for national collaboration on cluster policy and ways of working
- Created as a bottom-up association by 7 cluster organisations from diverse industries
- Supported by national government through project grants
- 25 members, representing 16 industries





WHY "Clusters of Sweden"? Nhy we formed the association




Sweden needs a national cluster agenda!




